Aligned Action: Fund Preschool Special Education!

In a letter signed by Liftoff WNY and 90 organizations across the state, the Kids Can't Wait campaign strongly urged Governor Cuomo to adopt the State Education Department's recommendation to increase funding for preschool special education programs. There is a long-standing history of inadequate growth in tuition rates that has forced providers to cut costs or close programs, accelerated the shortage of services and denied young children with developmental delays and disabilities their right to a free appropriate public education.

State Budget Fails to Support Young Children with Developmental Delays and Disabilities

The Statewide Kids Can't Wait campaign expressed disappointment in the lack of funding for Early Intervention and Preschool Special Education programs. 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Child Care Wins Big in New York State Budget

Liftoff WNY joined with hundreds of advocates of the Empire State Campaign for Child Care and Winning Beginning NY to push for investments in early care and education in the FY 2021-2022 Budget. We are thrilled to announce the New York State Legislature and Governor Cuomo have made use of Federal funding from the American Rescue plan and previous rounds of stimulus dollars, as well as a tax increase on the highest income New Yorkers. This will expand access to child care subsidies, decrease the costs for child care for parents, expand Universal Pre-Kindergarten and equalize subsidy eligibility requirements throughout the State.

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Help Me Grow WNY Announces Partnership with Liftoff

Help Me Grow Western New York has been engaged in a strategic planning process since 2020. While COVID-19 slowed down the process a bit, HMGWNY is making final additions to the plan and is eager to share its progress in the coming months.

One bit of exciting news is Liftoff's upcoming involvement with HMGWNY - which will now be supported by both CCNY and Liftoff WNY. Liftoff will provide strategic leadership and policy guidance to HMG, while CCNY will provide systems data leadership. How will this happen? As an aligned action network, Liftoff will advocate for system changes (policies, resources, practices) by engaging with early childhood coalitions and intermediary organizations, schools, healthcare and public health professionals, and others so that WNY has a more responsive, coordinated, and integrated early childhood system. CCNY and Liftoff will work collaboratively to define the types of data and data reports to inform the system and inform advocacy/policy priorities.
