2021 was a great year for Liftoff. We fine-tuned our strategic advocacy agendas, launched our social media, focused on building the team to address growing communications and administrative needs, and established a new partnership with Help Me Grow WNY. A Year of Aligned Action & Advocacy



As an Aligned Action Network, Liftoff has strongly advocated for improvements to the early childhood developmental services systems (such as Preschool Special Education and Early Intervention) since 2019. Throughout 2021, Liftoff shared several opportunities to take action and advocate for budgetary and <u>legislative</u> <u>changes</u> at the state-level. At year end, we saw that collective work and advocacy come to fruition when Governor Hochul signed a package of legislation that included one of Liftoff's major priorities – increase funding for Early Intervention. This action by the Governor (and the Senate and Assembly in June) will reverse decades of disinvestment in key supports and services for infants and toddlers with special needs.

As a leadership member of the statewide 'Kids Can't Wait' campaign, Liftoff co-signed a statement regarding the 'Early Intervention Covered Lives and Preschool Special Education' legislation. As shared in the statement, we are eager to join with Governor Hochul and all leaders committed to equity in education to ensure these investments are sustainable and meet the needs of all New York's children.

Help Me Grow WNY & Liftoff Partnership



CCNY, Inc. in partnership with Liftoff announced Help Me Grow WNY's new Strategic Framework and partnership in 2021. Moving forward, HMGWNY will focus on two areas in particular, data and policy. Building a complex data infrastructure to capture screenings and track outcomes will help service providers identify gaps and solve problems and offer a strong foundation for policy advocacy (led by Liftoff) leading to transformative legislative change. Additionally, HMGWNY is poised to expand developmental promotion, early detection and screening, and linkages to services that support a child's healthy development. HMGWNY will partner with health care professionals, child care providers, schools, Head Start/Early Head Start, county governments, and community coalitions to create a stronger and more equitable system of support for young children and their families.

Liftoff's Lunch & Learn Series continued in 2021. Two of our most popular programs included:

The "American Rescue Plan Act: Policy Challenges and Opportunities for NY Children and Families" with Dede Hill, Policy Director for the Schuyler Center for Analysis and Advocacy. Dede shared a high-level overview of the child-focused federal relief package's impacts and investments for children and families; and

"<u>NYS Action Plan for a Strong and Equitable Child Care System</u>" 2021. In 2018, Governor Cuomo assembled a Task Force of experts to develop innovative solutions to improve access to quality, affordable child care in NY. Members of the Task Force spotlighted the recommendations to create a child care system that is more affordable, accessible, high-quality, and coordinated.

In January and April, Liftoff partnered with the New York Funders Alliance, the Greater Rochester Health Foundation, and Bolder Advocacy to provide advocacy trainings for our partners in philanthropy.
